

FOR WOMEN GOLFERS OF ALL SKILL LEVELS

2024 Play Days

Women's Play Days are single-day events open to all female NCGA members. They are scheduled and conducted within each of 7 geographic areas by volunteer tournament coordinators. Each area has autonomy on how to run their Play Days so you will see various formats: individual play, team play, 4-ball (partners) and more. Each area conducts 5-8 events per year.

Events listed as Niners are events specifically for those golfers who prefer to play 9 holes.

One thing they all have in common is the Area Winner Circle - a yearlong 'race' for points within each area. Players accumulate points when they participate and perform well in Play Days. While players can earn points in any area, the year-end Winner Circle awards are made in each of the seven areas.

Area Winner Circle – Program

What is the Area Winner Circle Program (AWC)?

Players accumulate points through the season when they participate and perform well in Area Play Days. Play Days are grouped by Area. Points may be earned on any play day. Year-end awards are made within each of seven areas (listed below). Areas: Bay, Fresno, Monterey/South Bay, North Central, Redwood, Sacramento, Stockton

How are Points Awarded?

Points are accumulated at Play Days throughout the year. The player that shoots the lowest gross score receives 10 points, the person with the next lowest gross score receives 9 points, the next 8 and so on down to one point. The same occurs for low net scores. Points of 10, 9, 8, etc. are awarded to the person with the lowest net, second lowest net, etc. If two or more women tie, all ties receive the same number of points. One person can place (and get points) in both the low gross and low net categories. At the end of the year the three players with the highest number of points will receive AWC medals for their 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place showing in both Low Gross and Low Net Divisions. In the case of the AWC medals, a woman can win in either the Low Gross or the Low Net category but not both. Player will win the highest award for which she is eligible. Example: Player is 2nd Low Net and 3rd Low Gross, she would be awarded the 2nd place in Low Net TIES: If there are ties for the final awards, the following method for breaking ties shall be used: For 1st Low Gross or Low Net – Sudden Death Playoff 2nd and 3rd place ties are broken by a card off For both Gross and Net formats ties shall be broken by: Back 9, back 6, back 3

AREA TEAM PLAY CHALLENGE

This is a separate team qualifying event scheduled on July 15 at Whitney Oaks. Winners from the Sacramento Area will go on to compete against other area winners on September 16-17 at Hiddenbrooke GC in Vallejo, CA.
