Awards: 5 - \$1,000 scholarships to be awarded in 2026.

Requirements: The “Puget Sound CSI Memorial Foundation” considers a school scholarship to be an investment in you so in a Word document, prepare a one-to-two-page written essay including:

1. Contact information (essential to reach back to you):
 - a. Full name
 - b. USPS Mailing address
 - c. E-mail address
 - d. Phone number (voice and/or text)
2. Descriptive information:
 - a. Make a personal statement about yourself.
 - b. State what you know about constructions specifications (e.g. Project Manual & format).
 - c. Explain any involvement with the Construction Specifications Institute (e.g. Puget Sound Chapter, student programs, ProSpec tradeshow, certificate preparation classes, or other).
3. Academic information:
 - a. What is your current course of study and school?
 - b. What are your academic goals and level of education you plan to achieve?
 - c. How would an award of a scholarship benefit your educational pursuits?
4. Career Information:
 - a. What is your Immediate goal after your education is completed?
 - b. What are your long-term occupation goals?

Submittals: Applications and information provided therein will be considered confidential and will not be distributed outside of the PS CSI MF Scholarship Committee. Tips for Successful Award

- Make your application stand out.
 - Share your story.
 - Tell us things we will remember.
 - Give us a reason to grant you a scholarship.
- Prepare the essay to:
 - Mention your aspirations and what you will do with your education.
 - Address how activities outside of school (e.g. community organizations or volunteering) are a part of your overall strategy or fit with your educational goals.
 - Show how a scholarship award will make you more successful in the pursuit of your education and career.
- Proofread your submittal and have someone review it before applying.
