Graduation Requirements

Note: Meeting the state graduation requirements meets or exceeds minimum college admissions requirements at all public in-state colleges and most colleges in general

4 credits Language Arts (*at RHS includes one year AP or CIHS*)

3 credits social studies & *Washington State History met*

3 credits math + *1 for college (or senior-year quantitative course)*

3 credits science

2 credits World Language (same language)/Or 2 Credits of PPR

1.0 Career Connected Learning/Career Technical Education (CTE)

2.0 Art (*2 semesters in same category – Visual Arts, Music, or Theatre - for University of California schools*)/(Or **1 Fine Art and 1 PPR for your 2 credits**)

1.5 PE or waivers

.5 Health

60 hours service learning

Complete State Graduation Pathways requirements in ELA and Math (different from the credit requirement for graduation) or CTE

*PPR – Personalized Pathway Requirement – can be any classes

Graduation Pathway Requirement – ELA & Math

All students must meet the state grad pathway requirement, but there are now multiple ways to do this:

EXAMS: SBA, SAT, ACT

COURSEWORK: ELA – APLA, CIHS English, APUSH, AP Psych, Running Start English

Math – AP Calc, AP Stats, AP Comp Sci, CIHS Business Math 130,
Running Start Math – Coming soon: AP Precalculus

CTE PATHWAY: Earn 2 credits (complete 4 classes) in a CTE Program Area at Roosevelt (or SPS Skills Center)

- Roosevelt Program Areas:
 - Business & Marketing (includes Computer Science)
 - Human Services (Culinary, Psychology, and other FASCE courses, ASL)
 - Skills & Technical Sciences (Photography through AP Photography, Theatre Tech, and SPS Skills Center programs)
 - STEM (Engineering)
 - Agricultural Ed (APES, Biotech, Systems Medicine)

MILITARY PATHWAY: For students who are planning in pursuing a career in one of the military branches and complete the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery)
