We're very excited to share that the 49th Dixie Crow Symposium realized a **\$3.3M Economic Impact to Houston County and the local Warner Robins, Georgia Community**. The Dixie Crow Technical Symposium (22-26 March 2025) ... was another FABULOUS EVENT! The Exhibit Hall hosted 57 vendors all displaying their technology with a few participating in our Crows N.E.S.T. STEM Event. The Dixie Crow Chapter facilitates the objectives "Advancing Electromagnetic Warfare TOGETHER" of the Association of Old Crows through social events, technical symposia, monthly newsletters STEM initiatives, and monthly meetings with guest speakers. The symposium is an annual event – attended by representatives from defense industry, academia, and government (military & civil service). In addition to being a forum for technical interchange, the symposium is also a major fund-raiser, supporting the Dixie Crow Scholarship Education Foundation, and providing donations to various local universities, schools, and charitable organizations.

Since 1979 the chapter has awarded a total of **\$1.487M in Scholarships** to provide financial assistance to deserving individuals pursuing a degree in engineering/hard sciences with the potential for enhancing the field of Electronic Warfare (EW) and the Electromagnetic Spectrum (EMS). The Dixie Crow Chapter also supports the Museum of Aviation Foundation and the National STEM Academy through contributions and hands on support more than **\$250,000 to date** to benefit the Robins Air Force Base Museum of Aviation EW Exhibit and STEM activities.

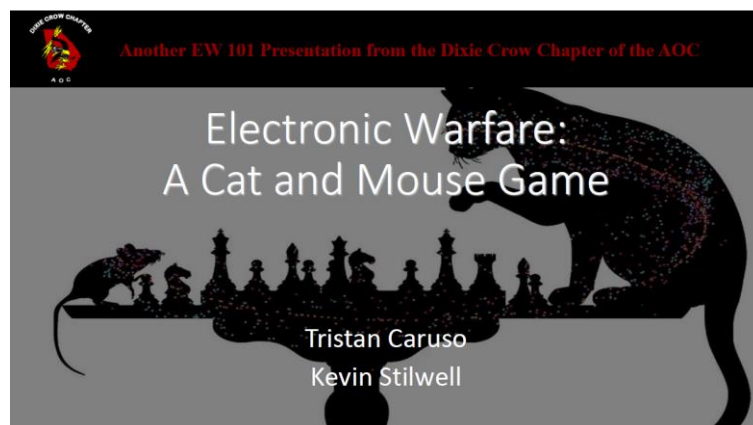

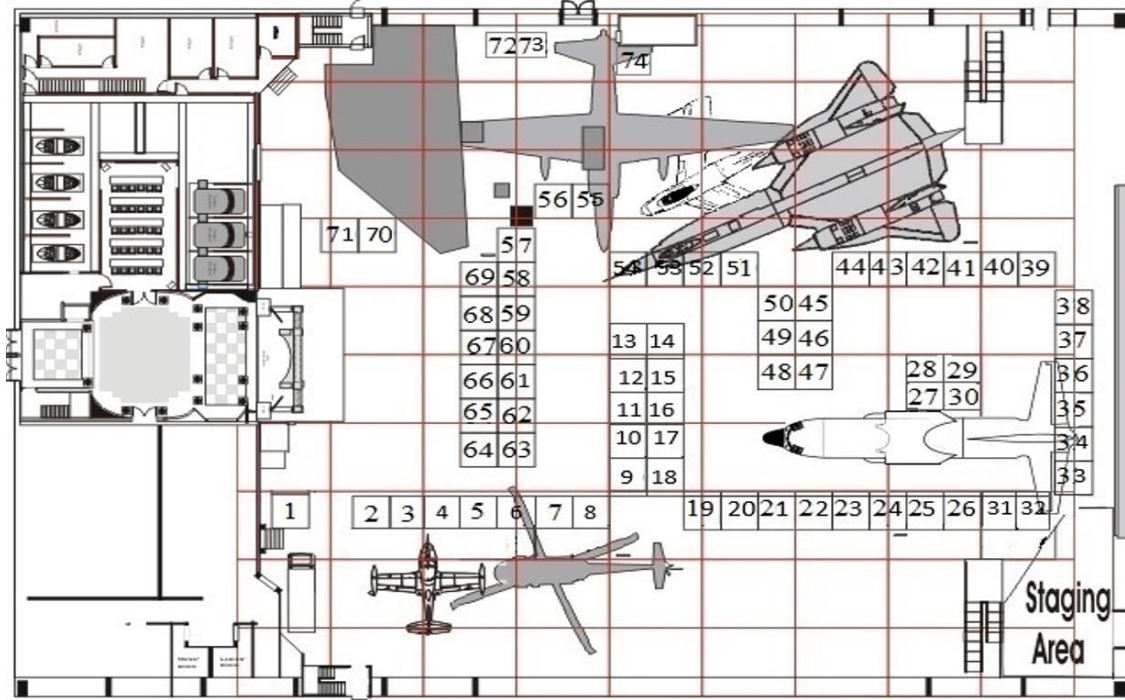

- **Museum EW Exhibit Refresh – AN/ALE-55 FOTD (Fiber Optic Towed Decoy) & AN/ALQ-131 Jammer Pod added to the F-16 Murals in the EW Exhibit Breezeway of the Electronic Air Force Exhibit in the Robins AFB Museum of Aviation! ☺**

The Dixie Crow Chapter officially cuts the ribbon for the Robins AFB Museum of Aviation EW Exhibit addition of the AN/ALE-55 Fiber Optic Towed Decoy and AN/ALQ-131 Jammer Pod to the F-16 Murals Exhibit.

- “Two F-16 Fighting Falcons streak through the sky on a daring mission to strike a high-value target. Suddenly, their Radar Warning Receivers alert them to danger—Surface-to-Air Missiles are tracking their every move. As the pilots’ Electronic Warfare systems detect the jets entering the missile’s lethal range, they deploy the AN/ALE-55 Fiber Optic Towed Decoy. Trailing behind the aircraft on a tether, this ingenious device lures enemy missiles away by presenting a more tempting target than the F-16s themselves. With advanced Electronic Warfare technology, the pilots gain critical situational awareness of threats—seen or unseen—ensuring they stay one step ahead in the fight.”
